Speech and Drama students, along with their younger siblings, were treated to a special celebration this Matariki — a Potluck and Poetry evening hosted by Speech NZ tutor, Sjann, at her home.

Sjann from Shine Bright, who is a new Speech NZ Tutor teaching drama from a cosy studio on the farm! This gathering was an extension of a tradition Sjann celebrates each year for Matariki. This time, the wider Speech NZ whānau joined in, sharing kai and enjoying a poetry recital from every child attending. It turned into a lively event, with a few extra friends invited along, even the two-year-old joined in with a song they had prepared!

The older children stepped up to support the younger ones, either standing beside nervous performers or joining in unison, just as they did for a four-year-old who forgot her words during Once I Caught a Fish Alive.

Sjann said making the event potluck-style meant "minimal effort on my part, no stress about food prep!" She also shared that in the two weeks leading up to the evening, children would run excitedly across the school grounds to tell her they had learned and been practising their poems. "I just loved their enthusiasm," she said.

LITTLE DID YOU KNOW: ADVICE FOR A SOLE TRADER

CHATGPT IS CHANGING THE WAY WE TALK, TEXT AND WRITE

As a sole trader, your reputation is important. Remember to continually build on your brand, this includes the tone of voice you use in your written communication.

The tone in which it's delivered is crucial for creating a lasting impression and fostering a connection with your audience. A consistent tone helps build trust, familiarity, and a strong brand identity.

Use ChatGPT as a Tool, Not as a Solution!

ChatGPT is an amazing resource, but it's important to use it as a tool rather than relying on it to write your text from scratch. This way, you maintain control and ownership over the content.

First, type up the information you want to communicate. Then, paste it into ChatGPT's prompt field and ask it to check the vocabulary and readability. ChatGPT can suggest changes to make your text flow better. These suggestions might include reordering sentences, improving word choice, or adding missing punctuation such as full stops, speech marks, and commas.

ChatGPT is influencing the way we speak!

Since <u>ChatGPT</u>'s explosive debut in late 2022, millions of people have used it to help <u>write</u> <u>everything</u> from emails and essays to wedding vows and apology texts.

But now, researchers are noticing something surprising: All is doing more than helping us write to a point of actually changing the way we speak.

A <u>recent analysis</u> by researchers at the Max Planck Institute, highlighted in Scientific American, reveals that words commonly used by ChatGPT, like "delve," "tapestry" and "nuance," are showing up more frequently in everyday conversation.

After examining over 700,000 hours of transcribed podcasts and YouTube videos, researchers found a statistically significant uptick in GPT-style vocabulary

• WAYS CHATGPT CAN HELP

LESSON PLANNING & RESOURCES

- Suggest ideas for lesson outlines, activities, and teaching strategies tailored to your subject and age group.
- Generate custom worksheets, quizzes, and comprehension questions.
- Create reading passages or examples at different difficulty levels.

DIFFERENTIATION & PERSONALISATION

- Adapt materials for students with different abilities, including simplified explanations or extended challenges.
- Rewrite content in plain English, or make it more engaging with stories, analogies, or real-world examples.
- Suggest accommodations for ESOL learners or students with learning differences.

3. ASSESSMENT SUPPORT

- Draft quiz questions, marking rubrics, or model answers.
- Help with feedback phrasing that is constructive but encouraging.
