FLEXI SPEAKING AND PERFORMING 2021

If using the same book for more than one section, ensure candidates can offer different information for each section. **Remember**, candidates need to take in a programme. Original poems must be memorised

Grade 3 Rua 5: The story or talk based upon the item bought in may be imaginative or real-life

Grade 8 Tahi 6: In the discussion, contrasting literary periods can be back-to-back.

Grade 8 Rua 1 : Book of Poetry

Spend time finding a poem that really suits the candidate and the syllabus task.


