Farewelling Helen Balch

It is with regret that we accept Helen's resignation as a trustee on the Speech New Zealand Board. Helen has been a valued trustee for the last eight years. She was appointed to the Speech New Zealand Board as the SCA representative and was the Inaugural Chair of EPC, established in 2022.

Helen has a large teaching business in Christchurch, based at St Andrew's College. She has entered thousands of well-prepared students in Speech New Zealand examinations. This teaching background and knowledge equipped Helen to be in charge of syllabus revision. Until Covid-19 lockdowns the syllabi revisions were cycled through on a rotational basis. However, the impact of Covid-19 necessitated some lateral thinking and one summer's day in Nelson, Helen proposed writing a syllabus that covered Speech and Drama and Public Speaking. And so a group of four wrote the Flexi Speaking and Public Speaking Syllabus. Helen donated SNZ's first scholarship for Flexi Speaking and Public Speaking, The Gabrielle Balch Scholarship, in recognition of her mother's contribution to Speech New Zealand as a Local Secretary for many years.

Helen is a very methodical person with an eye for detail. She can always be relied on to read documents in an analytical manner and this has been of great benefit to Speech New Zealand.

As part of her teaching programme, Helen always supported the Performing Arts and PACANZ. This provided her with links to teachers all over the country. Helen was a regular attendee to the SCA's annual conferences and so was in touch with practising Speech and Drama teachers. These contacts resulted in Helen being able to give relevant feedback as background to Board initiatives.

Helen has an indomitable spirit and enthusiasm for life. She has amazed us all by fronting up to meetings and events while coping with severe health issues. Speech New Zealand is going to miss Helen's common sense-approach and her experience as respected Speech and Drama Christchurch teacher.
